# Artificial Intelligence Influence

In AY 2024-2025, 289 cases were related to AI (859 total).

Violations the Honor Code with use of Artificial Intelligence:

- Cheating - Unauthorized Aid: 142
- Cheating: 106
- Falsification - Violation of Classroom Rule: 21
- Plagiarism - Copied Material: 16
- Plagiarism - Improper Citation: 16
- Plagiarism: 8



# What happens to most students?

The Academic Integrity Workshop: 3-weeks, online, self-paced.

## Learning Outcomes:

- Understand the Honor Code policies
- Develop **decision-making skills**
- **Evaluate the effects** of their behavior

Assignments are grouped into three sections; **Incident Reflection, Community Impact, and Looking Ahead**. Examples include:

- Incident Narrative – reflection on incident and decision-making
- Success Strategies – connect with an on-campus resource of choice
- Letter to My Professor – reflect on professor's perspective and importance of integrity in a University setting

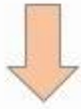
Grading is on a pass/fail basis with 2 attempts at passing for each assignment

# The Artificial Intelligence (AI) Module

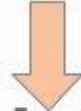
Learning outcomes:

- Examine how their behavior and experiences **impact their personal values** and how those personal **values translate to their future identity**
- Demonstrate an ability to make **ethical decisions** that will enhance student success at Carolina and beyond

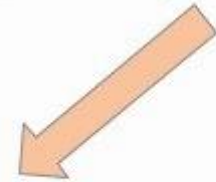

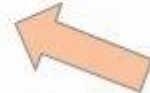
